
About Omaha Performing Arts

Retaining spending by Douglas County residents within the county Employing local residents and businesses through Omaha Performing Arts' operations and repair, maintenance and renovation of its facilities



The Economic Impact Study

"The Economic and Fiscal Impact of Omaha Performing Arts on Douglas County and the State of Nebraska, 2016 Update" prepared by Dr. Eric Thompson (University of Nebraska-Lincoln).

First study - 2007 through 2011; second study FY2014 and third study FY2016.

Includes all Omaha Performing Arts' activities at the Orpheum Theater and Holland Center.

Does <u>not</u> include constituent group use (Omaha Symphony, Opera Omaha, etc.), special events (weddings, dinners, corporate meetings, etc.) or Omaha Performing Arts' activities held at other facilities, such as Jazz on the Green (annual attendance: 60,000).
